**World Championship or Continental Championships Event Regulations (v.4.1 last updated 16/01/17
– master copy is held by the class secretary details above)**

1. The World Championships and Continental Championships shall be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing, the MSCA Class Event Regulations, and any amendments thereto approved in writing by the MSCA and in force one month prior to the date the Notice of Race is issued.
2. Frequency - The Championship shall be held in accordance with the MSCA long term regatta plan.
3. Countries having an active National Class Fleet and National Class Association shall be entitled to apply to run the World Championship and Continental Championships, the MSCA committee will also consider (wildcard) applications if appropriate and shall make the venue selection.
4. Entries - The event is an open event with no entry restrictions.
5. Eligibility - The helmsman shall be a current member of their National Class Association, or the MSCA where no National Class Association exists.
6. Measurement - Boats and sails may be subject to event equipment inspection in accordance with the MSCA Class Rules.
7. The organisers shall for World Championships and may for Continental Championships appoint a Chief Event Equipment Inspector as per the requirements of the Event Regulations and World Sailing.
8. Course - The type of course shall be of a windward - leeward configuration.
9. Number of Races - The championship shall comprise of up to 15 races of which the score of one may be discarded if 5 or more races are completed and the score of two may be discarded if 10 or more races are completed. If less than 3 races are sailed the Trophy shall not be awarded.
10. Prizes - The title shall be awarded to the helmsman who has won the event.
11. The trophy shall be held by the winning helmsman until the next event, or for one year but will remain the property of the MSCA. It will be the responsibility of the holder to see that the trophy is cared for and in the hands of the organising authority by the start of the next event or returned to the MSCA secretary one year later whichever is sooner. It is the responsibility of the winner to ensure the trophy is engraved at their own cost.
12. Interpretation - These rules shall be subject to interpretation and amendment by the Trophy Donor if appropriate and the Committee of the MSCA.
