

# ABOUT THE 2023 MSCA ANNUAL CLASS SURVEY

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### **ABOUT THIS SURVEY**



The 2023 MSCA Annual Class Survey was created by the International Committee of the Musto Skiff Class Association (MSCA), in partnership with the class boat builder and partner, Ovington Boats Ltd. This is the 20<sup>th</sup> Annual Class Survey to date.

### **PURPOSE & OBJECTIVES**

- The purpose of the MSCA Annual Class Surveys is to gather feedback from class members and the wider sailing community on all Musto Skiff activities. This includes feedback on the boat experience, training, organised events, and class marketing.
- In each survey, MSCA class members are invited to take part in an annual online International AGM. This provides an
  opportunity to vote for International Committee Members and Country Representatives, as well as vote on
  important class matters and proposals to grow and develop the class.
- In addition to direct feedback during the season from class members, the insights and feedback gathered from each survey help the International Committee understand what members want from the class association. It also helps to ensure the successful planning and delivery of future events such as National Championships and World Championships.
- For the continued improvement and growth of the class, each survey also includes a separate section to gather insights and feedback from the wider sailing community on how they view and engage with the Musto Skiff Class Association and its members.

### **METHODOLOGY**

- The latest survey, which is the 20th annual survey to date, was launched on the 15<sup>th</sup> of December 2023. The survey was open for six weeks, closing on 26th January 2024.
- The online survey was accessible via a survey link, which was made available via the main class social media platforms (i.e., the class Facebook Page, Facebook Groups, and the X (formerly Twitter) page), the class website, and the monthly class eNews, which includes 1,100+ subscribers. The survey link was also shared in relevant sailing media via a press release, inviting both class members and the wider sailing community to participate.
- The wider sailing community (i.e., those who are interested in the class but don't currently sail a Musto Skiff) was invited to respond to a specific set of questions with the objective of gathering their views on the class and any potential interest in joining the class. The purpose of including this survey group is to ensure we are presenting ourselves as a positive and welcoming class in the sailing community and to understand how to attract new sailors to further grow the class.
- Upon the close of the survey, all responses were collated, and the survey results were reviewed by the MSCA International Committee. Key insights and results from the 2023 MSCA Annual Class Survey are included in this report, which was published in early April 2024.
- Survey responses are always strictly confidential, and any data gathered from the survey is only reported in the aggregate. All survey information is coded and will remain confidential.

### **ABOUT THIS SURVEY**



### **2023 INTERNATIONAL AGM – ONLINE**

The International AGM for the Musto Skiff class is hosted online each year via this survey to ensure sailors in every country can participate and vote on important class matters. Only current class members are eligible to participate in this AGM. This year's International AGM was accessible online via a separate survey link provided at the end of the 2023 Annual Class Survey.

This year's International AGM included a class member vote on a proposal to adopt the new smaller mainsail, which was subsequently launched in early 2024. The proposal included options to integrate the small mainsail into the existing class for a 2-year period to assess the uptake and determine how to enable those with the small mainsail to participate in the main class events. Class members could also vote on International Committee Members and Country Representatives for the 2024 season.

### **ACCEPTED LIMITATIONS**

Whilst the Annual Class Surveys are aimed at Musto Skiff sailors and the wider sailing community, the MSCA International Committee accepts that the survey is posted publicly and, therefore, open for anyone to respond. As such, insights and data are always considered alongside other information resources, historical trends, and information already known about the class, its members, and MSCA activities. Some survey submissions may be omitted from the final count and analysis if it is suspected that any submission is fake or a duplicate.

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 With the acceptance of some limitations with this type of survey, the MSCA Annual Survey continues to be a valuable resource to guide future decisions and considerations around class events, marketing, committee activities, and the boat experience.

### **2023 SAILOR DEMOGRAPHICS – MUSTO SKIFF SAILORS AND OTHER SAILORS**

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### Sailor Representation in the 2023 Survey:

- Musto Skiff sailors represent 81% of all survey participants, and 94% of this total are also MSCA class members. (In the 2022 survey, 83% of participants owned a Musto Skiff and 79% were MSCA class members.)
- Other sailors (i.e., those from a class outside the Musto Skiff class) represent 19% of all survey participants. This is a decrease from the 2022 survey, which reported 17% representation for 'other sailors'. In the 2021 survey, 'other sailors' represented 22% of all participants, so this represents another year-on-year decrease for this group.

### **Country Representation:**

- Overall, the 2023 Annual Class Survey attracted 128 responses in total, representing 11 countries. Whilst this response
  rate is a slight increase from the 2022 Survey, the number of countries represented is lower, with 19 countries
  represented in the previous 2022 Survey.
- For **Musto Skiff sailors**, the most represented country in the 2023 Survey is the UK (65%), followed by Germany (10%), and then Australia (7%). Rounding out the top five are the Netherlands (4%), and then France and Ireland (both at 3%).
- For all other sailors, the most represented country in the 2023 Survey is the UK (50%), followed by Australia, Denmark, France, Switzerland, and the USA, all with an equal share of 7% each.



### **Sailor Demographics:**

- For the Musto Skiff sailors in the 2023 Survey, the most represented age groups are sailors aged 35–39 years, at 18%. The next most represented age groups are sailors aged 40–44 years at 14%, followed by sailors aged 25–29 years and 50–54 years at 11% each. Youth sailors (24 years and under) represent 9% of all Musto Skiff sailors in the 2023 Survey. This is an increase on the 2022 Survey, which reported youth sailors at 6% share of all participants.
  - A wide age range is represented in the 2023 Survey for **all other sailors.** However, one of the most represented age groups includes sailors aged 16–19 years and 35–39 years, at 21% each. This indicates a younger demographic is showing interest in the Muto Skiff class, with the 2022 Survey reporting those aged 55–59 years as the most represented (at 16% in 2022).

### 2023 MARKETING AND COMMUNICATIONS – KEY INSIGHTS

### Most Engaged Marketing Platform:

- The Musto Skiff International Facebook Page was the most engaged marketing platform for Musto Skiff sailors, with 63% using it always or often. This was followed closely by the Musto Skiff International Facebook groups and online sailing media (PR and event reports), with 59% of Musto Skiff sailors using these channels always or often.
- For other sailors, the International Class Facebook page was the most engaged platform to find information about the class at 32% share, followed by the International Class website at 30% share, and then the class Facebook groups at 16% share. SS3982 SE4983 GBR627 GBR432

### **Social Media Engagement:**

- Out of all the official social media channels for the class, the International Musto Skiff Class Facebook Page was the most engaged social media platform for the Musto Skiff class in 2023. This was also the most popular social media platform with all other sailors.
- Key trends for social media engagement over 2023 included a continued shift from Facebook groups to using а. WhatsApp local groups for community chats.
- The least engaged platform for the Musto Skiff class over 2023 was the International Musto Skiff X (formerly Twitter) page, with 95% stating that they never use it. This was also the least popular social media platform with other sailors.



### PR & Media Engagement:

- For Musto Skiff sailors, the most popular sailing media over 2023 included yachtsandyachting.com with 31% share (up from 24% share in 2022), followed by Sailing Anarchy at 19% share (slightly up from 18% in 2022), and then Yachts & Yachting Magazine at 10% share.
- For 2023, Yachts & Yachting Magazine replaced Sail-World.com for **Musto Skiff sailors**, which had an 8% share in the 2022 survey but is now reported as having a 7% share based on the 2023 survey participant group.
- For **all other sailors**, the most popular sailing media over 2022 also included yachtsandyachting.com at 24% share, followed by Yachts & Yachting Magazine, Sailing Anarchy, and Regatta, all with 9% share each.

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### **2023 ORGANISED EVENTS AND TRAINING – KEY INSIGHTS**

### Based on Musto Skiff sailors participating in the 2023 survey:

30% of Musto Skiff sailors participated in organised open meetings over 2023.

34% of Musto Skiff sailors participated in either organised or informal training during 2023. This was an increase from 2022, which reported that 28% of the class members participated in organised training.

19% of all the training that took place over 2023 was informal training arranged by sailors in the local fleets.

26% of Musto Skiff sailors said there was no organised training or coaching in their region over 2023. This is a decrease from the 2022 survey, which reported 31% stating that they had no organised training or coaching.

75% of Musto Skiff sailors would like to have more organised training in their region in 2024. This is an increase on the 2022 survey, which reported 70% wanting to have more organised training in their region.

### **2023 VIEWS ON INCREASING INTEREST IN THE MUSTO SKIFF CLASS**

### Based on other sailors participating in the 2023 survey:

- 57% would join the Musto Skiff class. This is up from 44% in the 2022 survey.
- 21% would maybe join the Musto Skiff class. This is down from 33% in the 2022 survey.
- 25% plan to look for a boat within the next 6 months. This was no change from the 2022 survey.
- 50% plan to look for a boat within the next 6–12 months. This is up from 12% in the 2022 survey.
- 25% have no plans to get a Musto Skiff to join the 2024 season.

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



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






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### **MUSTO SKIFF CLASS: SAILOR WEIGHT RANGE IN SURVEY**


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



### **2023 RESULTS SUMMARY:**

According to Musto Skiff sailors in the survey, the top 3 reasons preventing new sailors from getting a Musto Skiff boat includes:

- 1. Sailors being worried it's too hard to sail (32% share of responses)
- Sailors being worried they are too light in weight to sail a Musto Skiff (17% share of responses)
- 3. No fleets nearby (13% share of responses)

The 3 things that Musto Skiff sailors think the class association or boat builder can do to encourage more sailors to join the Musto Skiff fleet are:

- 1. Invite sailors to participate in a demo day (25% share of responses)
- 2. Run more on the water training events (21% share of responses)
- 3. Increase online sailing video content on the Musto Skiff YouTube channel (16% share of responses)

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

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








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### **OTHER SAILORS: SAILOR WEIGHT RANGE IN SURVEY**



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



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

#### **2023 INTERNATIONAL AGM PARTICIPATION**

- This year's online AGM included 44 participants representing six countries. This was a decrease in participants compared to the 2022 online AGM, which included 59 participants representing six countries.
- Of all the class members who participated in the 2023 online AGM, 73% are active Musto Skiff Class Association members. This is a decrease compared to the 2022 online AGM, which reported a 97% share. However, more Life Members took part in the 2023 online AGM, with 27% share in the 2023 online AGM compared to just 3% share in 2022.

#### **2023 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS ATTENDANCE & FEEDBACK**

- 30% of Musto Skiff Class members attended a National Championship event in 2023.
- 53% of Musto Skiff Class members had a Nationals event but did not attend, and 18% stated that there was no Nationals event hosted in their country over 2023.
- The quality of Nationals events was rated as 'good to excellent' overall, indicating a high quality of events on average for each country.
- The level of competition in the fleet was rated very highly overall for 2023 at 92% excellent and 8% good, with no ratings below this.



- On average, information and communication during the events, club facilities, and on-shore organisation were mainly rated as good to excellent overall. Venue suitability for championships was rated particularly high overall, with a rating of 100% good to excellent.
- On average, feedback for organised evening socials was variable, but for those who had evening socials at their Nationals, the majority rated them as 42% 'good' overall.
- For those that could not attend their Nationals event, 'other commitments' was the main reason given for nonattendance at 80% share, followed by registering a place but having to miss the event due to injury or being unwell. Some of the main reasons provided for 'other' include the venue location being too far to travel to.

### PLANNING FOR 2024 NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

- 69% of class members in the 2023 online AGM intend to participate in their 2024 National Championships, with 18% stating "maybe", and 13% stating that they do not intend to participate.
- Main reasons for not attending the 2024 National Championships include the timing of the 2024 Worlds, clashing with other sailing event commitments (in other classes), a lack of holiday, and family commitments.



### LOOKING AHEAD TO THE 2024 WORLDS IN WEYMOUTH & PORTLAND (UK)

- 71% stated 'yes' to attending the 2024 Worlds planned for Weymouth & Portland in the UK, 13% stated 'maybe' to attending, and 15% stated 'no'.
- The main reasons for not committing to the planned 2024 Worlds include other commitments (82%), and not feeling good enough to compete in a World Championship due to being new to the class (18%).
- The main reasons for 'other' include a lack of practice and the distance to travel to the venue location.

#### LOOKING AHEAD TO THE 2025 WORLDS IN SYDNEY (AUSTRALIA)

- 13% stated 'yes' to attending the 2025 Worlds planned for Sydney in Australia, 44% stated 'maybe' to attending, and 44% said 'no'.
- For those who said 'no' to attending the planned 2025 Worlds, the main reasons for not committing to the event include a lack of holiday days / total time required to travel and participate, the distance to travel to the location, and anticipated high costs for shipping and travel.



### FEEDBACK ON FUTURE WORLD CHAMPIONSHIP LOCATIONS

- The 2026 World Championship is set to be hosted in a location in Europe. Of the four locations suggested to the class members, Lake Como in Italy is the most popular, followed by Carnac in France, Barcelona in Spain, and then Palma in Spain.
- The 2027 World Championship is set to be hosted in a location outside of Europe. Of the two locations suggested to the class members, the USA (San Francisco or other cities in North America) is the most popular, followed by Langebaan in South Africa.
- The most popular alternative location suggested for a future Worlds is Denmark (Aarhus). The next most suggested locations, each with an equal number of suggestions, include England (Sunderland), Italy (Lake Garda), Portugal (Cascais or Porto), Switzerland (Silvaplana), and The Netherlands (Medemblik).



RESULTS FOR THE 2023 AGM CLASS MEMBER VOTE ON THE PROPOSAL TO INTRODUCE THE SMALL MAINSAIL ON A 2-YEAR TRIAL BASIS:

- 93% voted 'YES I support the proposal'
- 7% voted 'NO I do not support the proposal'

With the majority of class members voting in favour of the 'small mainsail proposal', the committee will now move forward with the proposal to enable those with a small mainsail to participate in the main events as part of a 2-year trial. This trial will be effective from the 2024 season with continued review. Any further changes or updates will be communicated with the class, as required.

#### **RESULTS FOR THE 2023 AGM CLASS MEMBER VOTE ON COMMITTEE MEMBERS FOR 2024:**

• All International Committee Members stand unopposed for 2024 with a majority vote of 'YES' from the class members.

All International Country Representatives (not already elected by local AGM voting) stand unopposed for 2024 with a majority vote of 'YES' from their local class members.

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






### **MSCA CLASS MEMBERS: BOAT RANGES REPRESENTED IN SURVEY**

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

Q: The 2024 World Championships is being planned for Weymouth & Portland in the UK over 15 to 21 July 2024. Do you intend to participate in this regatta?











**Q:** How do you rate the quality of the components of the Musto Skiff boat?



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


